A Message from Mayor Chuck Cahn



Welcome to the Fall 2016 edition of the Cherry Hill Township Community Magazine! There are so many great things happening in our community, and you'll find much of it located within these pages: from Township news and upcoming events, to an array of programs and classes for residents of all ages.

In Town Hall, my administration and Township Council are in the process of finalizing and adopting our municipal budget for the coming year, and I'm very pleased and proud to announce that, **for the fifth year in a row, there will be no increase in your municipal taxes.**

When I took office nearly five years ago, I promised to run the local government efficiently and effectively; to promote economic development and investment; and to adopt a holistic approach to Township operations that emphasized fiscal responsibility and strong municipal services.

At the same time, I felt strongly that maintaining a strong, vibrant and truly sustainable Cherry Hill community would require an important balancing act: promoting and encouraging economic revitalization and redevelopment that would enable continued investments our roads, public safety, open space, and recreation, while at the same time, maintaining the character and identity of our Township and the unique neighborhoods that comprise it.

After all, Cherry Hill has gained its reputation as a wonderful place to live and raise a family in large part because of our beautiful, close-knit neighborhoods, great schools, strong property values, recreational opportunities, and our beautiful open spaces and historic sites.

Today, we see that balance in action. We see the result of five years of prudent financial planning, smart budgeting,

emphasizing operational efficiency, and focusing on township-wide revitalization efforts.

The \$69 million budget we have proposed for Fiscal Year 2017 invests heavily in roads, public safety, historic properties, public works, recreation, property maintenance, and open space. It holds the line on taxes for yet another year, while at the same time, – funding the critical services and programs that help maintain the character of our neighborhoods and ensure that Cherry Hill remains a great place for all of our residents to live, work and play.

One of the main concerns I hear from residents is the condition of our roads. This year, we have scheduled 56 local roads for repair – nearly four times as many as in previous years – and we will continue to look for ways to work more efficiently and effectively to make a significant impact on our roads most in need of repair.

We are investing in our Police Department, including the grant-funded purchase of body cameras for every single one of our men and women in uniform, as an important step forward and protection for both our officers, and the men, women and children they are sworn to serve.

This year's budget includes significant recreation enhancements, as well. We recently unveiled brand new tennis courts at Cherry Hill West, built new multi-use fields at both high schools, installed new Pickleball courts in Erlton North, upgraded sport courts across town, improved several playgrounds, and continued to promote our trail system and fund restoration efforts at our Croft Farm and Barclay Farmstead.

We continue to realize savings on our

health benefits, at a time when many entities report rising costs; and we continue to control municipal debt – with 50 percent of our current debt on track to be paid off in the next five years. Many of these things are possible, not just because of our own prudent planning, but because of our commitment to promoting economic revitalization, efforts that have strengthened our local commercial landscape and provided the foundation for our success.

Large-scale projects such as Penn Medicine's reinvention of the old Syms department store and Kennedy Health's \$100 million reinvestment in its Cherry Hill campus provide a significant investment in Cherry Hill. They create jobs and revenue, and most importantly, they inspire continued investment from businesses of all shapes, sizes and sectors.

The resulting economic impact allows us as a Township to continue investing in our community, and to provide more services to our residents, while shifting some of the tax burden off of our hard-working families and seniors.

Our commercial landscape is changing, but the character of our Township is not. Cherry Hill is built on families and neighborhoods that are diverse, vibrant and engaged. That has not, and will not, change, and as a result.

New families are moving into our town at the highest rate in years, and many seniors are choosing to stay here well into retirement, as well.

As Mayor, I believe it is my job to continue working to move our community forward, in every respect. I welcome your thoughts and questions on these issues, and look forward to sharing more great news in the weeks and months to come.

Registration process

- ◆ You may register in person, by mail or online at:
<https://register.capturepoint.com/cherryhill>
- ◆ Township offices are open Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m.-5 p.m.
- ◆ Visa and Mastercard are accepted online
- ◆ If registering in person or by mail, a registration form must be properly filled out (including birthdate), signed and submitted with your payment.
 - Forms can be downloaded online
 - Checks payable to *Cherry Hill Township*.
 - Please submit separate checks for each program.

Registration deadlines

Unless noted, the registration deadline for all programs is one week prior to the start of the first class. Registration will still be accepted after the deadline, but may be subject to a \$15 late registration fee.

Non-Residents

- ◆ \$10 non-resident fee is required per class.
- ◆ Residents are given first priority to register.
- ◆ Free courses are limited to Cherry Hill residents, except for senior line dancing and ceramics, which require a non-resident fee each semester.

Waiting lists

Waiting lists are a source of contact and do not guarantee you will receive a call back. You will be contacted only if a space becomes available. If notified of an opening, you will have 24 hours to accept the space (with payment) or the opening will be offered to the next person.

Why separate checks?

If you register for multiple programs and one is full, submitting separate checks will allow us to return your check for closed programs, but register the rest of your requests.

Code of Conduct

Participants are expected to exhibit appropriate behavior at all times while participating, spectating, or attending any program or event sponsored by Cherry Hill Township. Failure to observe the Code of Conduct may result in your removal from a program without refund.

Registration waiver

Registration forms must be signed by the participant or parent/guardian. Class is to be attended by the registrant only. Parents and siblings are not permitted to stay in class unless indicated in description.

Cancellations/Refunds

- ◆ Cancellations or transfers must be made 7 days before the class begins.
- ◆ Refunds will not be given after the first day of class except in the case of injury or illness. Written documentation from a physician is required.
- ◆ Refunds subject to \$15 processing fee.
- ◆ Classes are subject to enrollment.
- ◆ Courses canceled due to inclement weather or instructor absence will be made up at the end of the session.
- ◆ Refunds will not be given for:
 - Classes under \$25
 - Ticket sales
 - Morning Fun

Free Smoke Detector Inspection & Installation for Seniors (65+)

One of the most important fire safety devices for the home is a smoke detector. When working smoke detectors are present, your chances of surviving a home fire double. It is estimated that a third of the smoke detectors are not working, often due to the failure to replace a worn out battery. Smoke detectors should be tested monthly and batteries replaced annually. Smoke detectors should be replaced when they are 10 years old. The Cherry Hill Fire Department understands that senior citizens may not be able to afford, test, or change the battery in their smoke detector; therefore that service is provided for you. If you need a smoke detector or are not sure that yours are in proper working order, please call to schedule an appointment. If it needs to be replaced the Fire Department will install a 10-year long life battery powered smoke detector free of charge.

Township road program targets 56 roads for repair

Work is underway on the Township's annual Road Maintenance Program, with 56 local roads scheduled to be repaved thorough the fall and into early 2017, a significant increase in the number of roads scheduled for repair compared to past years.

The program is funded by more than \$8 million allocated by Mayor Chuck Cahn and Township Council for road repairs this year. It includes a mill and overlay of each roadway, as well as isolated concrete work to alleviate tripping hazards.

"Road maintenance – and, specifically, making sure our roads are smooth and accessible for travel – is one of the most essential functions of local government," Mayor Cahn said. "We know that many of our local roads are aging, and it is a serious concern not just for residents, but for myself and Council as well. This year's expanded program will make significant improvements in some of the areas most in need of repair, and the result will be safer, smoother, and more easy-to-navigate streets for all our residents and motorists."

Last year, Mayor Cahn announced an increase in spending on local roads through the Township's budget, to allow the Department of Engineering to address a greater number of streets in need of repair as quickly as possible. The amount allocated for roadwork has quadrupled since 2012.

In addition to the municipal roads set for repaving, Camden County is in the midst of work to repave both Cooperlanding and Springdale Roads in the Township, while the New Jersey Department of Transportation has announced plans to repave the entire stretch of Route 70 in Cherry Hill in the coming months.

"We will continue to update residents by mail, on social media, and through the Township's website and email communications as additional roads are set for repair," Mayor Cahn said. "I am eager to see this program move forward, and make a meaningful impact on our neighborhoods."

Mayor, Council unveil Township sustainability plan

"This roadmap is a blueprint that will guide our entire community — government, businesses and residents alike

— to a more sustainable future, and reinforces Cherry Hill's position as a leader in municipal sustainability," said Mayor Chuck Cahn. "It is a living, breathing document; one that sets a solid foundation, while allowing us to track our progress and establish new goals as we move forward."

"I am especially proud that this plan looks beyond the traditional definition of 'sustainability,' to focus on elements like our history, diversity, and cultural resources," Cahn said. "These are aspects of our town that are essential to promote and preserve, if our goal is truly to maintain the vitality of all of Cherry Hill for our future generations."

All the roadmap's initiatives will be pursued through a strong partnership between the Township, Sustainable Cherry Hill, the Cherry Hill Environmental Board, Cherry Hill Public Schools and members of the community.

Turf fields near completion at Cherry Hill East, West

- New Croft Farm Athletic Fields.
- Continued preservation and investment at our historic properties at Croft Farm and Barclay Farmstead, including current outbuilding restoration efforts.
- Plans to construct a Kenilworth Connector Trail.
- Planned handicap-accessibility improvements to the Barclay, Croft and Old Orchard trails.
- Improvements to Cherry Valley, Ashland and Springbrook parks.
- And new path paving at Erlton North Park, Still Park, Ashland Park and Columbia Lake.

Back-to-School Traffic Reminders



As we begin a new school year, expect to see an increase in the number of pedestrians and bicyclists on our already-busy roads. With this surge in numbers of our young people walking and riding to and from school, the Cherry Hill Police

Department urges everyone to please drive safely and look ahead for children who may be crossing the road ahead or biking along the same route you are taking. Please take the time to explain to your own children the importance of looking both ways before crossing any street, crossing at corners of intersections whenever possible, and to never cross a street or enter a street from behind or between parked vehicles.

Plenty of school buses will be back on our roads during the typical rush hours, and motorists are reminded that it is illegal to pass, in either direction, a school bus that is stopped to pick up or discharge children with its red lights flashing and stop paddle extended. This offense could add 5 points to an offender's driver license along with heavy fines, so please be extra cautious and alert and always be on the lookout for these vehicles.

Please remember that a crossing guard's directions carry the weight of the law, and drivers must stop when instructed by a crossing guard. Passing a guard whose stop paddle is raised or passing another vehicle which has stopped for a guard are very serious safety offenses, and not only expose our children and guards to the dangers of being struck but also carry heavy penalties for those who are caught. Our guards are here to provide for the safety of our children, so please show them their due courtesy and respect.

All riders of bicycles, roller skates, and skateboards 17 years of age or younger are required by law to wear a safety helmet. Give our kids the praise they deserve for following the rules and wearing their helmets, and you'll be a great role model and provide positive reinforcement by wearing one yourself when heading out for family rides.

Slow down for work zones- we are nearing a very busy time of the year as road work is being accelerated and increased in order to wrap up before the colder weather arrives. Please look ahead for signs warning of upcoming work zones, and for any directions they may provide regarding the changing traffic patterns. These areas frequently involve workers or their equipment moving in or along passing traffic, so give them a break by applying your brakes. The best way to avoid crashes or other mishaps is to slow down below the posted speed limit when entering a work zone, to give yourself time to see lane changes ahead and safely react to them.

Hurricane Season

The Atlantic Hurricane Season is upon us and lasts through November. Are you prepared?

- Ready.gov is an excellent source of information with detailed facts about what to do **BEFORE**, **DURING** and **AFTER** a hurricane.
- Have a **Disaster Kit** ready. When packing a disaster kit, be sure to include six main items:
 - o Water
 - o Food
 - o First aid kit
 - o Tools
 - o Clothing, bedding, sanitation
 - o Special items - baby formula, medication, extra eye-glasses, bank account numbers, important family documents, etc.



Winter Safety Tips

Many people do not realize that fires are more prevalent in the winter than any other time of the year. Increased use of heating appliances such as fireplaces, wood burning stoves and space heaters add to the increase in fire incidents. Keep your family safe by following these guidelines:

- Discard hot ashes from your wood burning fireplace in a metal container with a tight fitting lid outside and away from the house.
- Inspect and clean all chimneys regularly. Although this is especially important for wood burning appliances, all fuel burning heating devices produce carbon monoxide which needs to be properly vented from the home. Assure a minimum of one working carbon monoxide detector exists within your home.
- Never use a range or oven for supplemental heating.
- If loss of power occurs, use a flashlight instead of candles or utilize battery operated candles (flameless candles).
- If you use an electric space heater, be sure to keep combustible materials such as furniture or draperies a minimum of 36 inches from the heater. The heater should be plugged directly into the wall outlet. Use only UL or FM listed heaters. Never use a space heater as a primary source of heat.
- Throughout the year, be sure every level of your home has a working smoke alarm, and be sure to check and clean it on a monthly basis.
- Plan and practice a home escape plan with your family.

Cooking Safety Tips

Cooking is often a relaxing and fun task that brings family and friends together, and it provides a great way to showcase your creativity and love of good food. Nevertheless, **cooking is also the number one cause of home fires and home injuries**. Being mindful while you cook, however, can go a long way to helping prevent these fires.

Here's what you need to know!

- Keep an eye on what you fry
- Be alert when cooking
- Keep things that can catch fire away from cooking area

Leaf Collection Procedures

Bagging Leaves - Keep bags open; NO plastic bags

- ◆ Leaves must be placed in biodegradable paper bags or open trash bins. Free leaf bags are available for pick up at the Department of Public Works and Town Hall.
- ◆ Bagging leaves helps prevent flooding.
- ◆ Bagging saves taxpayer funds, minimizing collection costs and allowing crews to tend to other Township business.
- ◆ Leaves in open cans or paper bags are picked up weekly on your regular collection day; rain or early snow won't delay pickup.
- ◆ Neighborhoods are cleaner. Leaf piles won't block traffic or blow onto neighbors' yards.
- ◆ It's safer. Leaf piles are a dangerous place for children to play.
- ◆ Fire hazards are reduced.

Private Lawn Services

If you hire a lawn service to rake your leaves, please note that they cannot rake leaves to the curb for municipal collection. It is the responsibility of the lawn service to haul leaves away. It is the homeowners' responsibility to ensure their lawn service provides proper removal. Lawn services may haul leaves to the Kresson Road Ecology Site. Please call Public Works for Ecology Site hours and to receive a permit to use the site.

Township Leaf Collection

The Township uses heavy equipment to collect leaves at the curb. Keep leaf piles in the parkstrip, as close to the curb as possible (but not in the street). Please wait until your neighborhood is posted with collection signs before raking leaves to the curb.

Please only place leaves at the curb, not branches or other yard waste. In addition, leaves placed curb side may not be closer than 10 feet from a storm drain.

Residents may take leaves directly to our Ecological Center on Kresson Road. Please call for dates and hours of operation.

Note: Please note that a second leaf pick-up is not guaranteed due to weather restraints. Again, bagging allows for guaranteed weekly collection.

Township Leaf Compost

The Township provides free leaf compost. Please note that supply is limited and provided on a first come, first served basis. Access to the property is limited to Department of Public Works yard hours. Compost is available to Cherry Hill residents only. No landscapers.

Trash & Recycling Reminders

Township ordinance requires that you set trash and recyclables curb side no earlier than 5:30 p.m. the night before collection and no later than 7 a.m. the day of collection. Yard waste containers should not exceed the 50lb weight limit. Trash and recycling weight should not exceed container limits.

Municipal Curb Side Recycling

Glass, aluminum, tin, newspaper, cardboard and #1, #2, #4, #5 & #7 plastics should be placed in designated blue Recycling containers. Recyclable items are collected by an automated truck and must be inside the container in order to be collected. Cherry Hill now practices single-stream recycling; there is no need to sort your recycling.

Municipal Drop Off Recycling Facility

Motor oil, car tires, electronics, cell phones, plastic bags, CFL/fluorescent bulbs, rechargeable batteries and car batteries can be deposited at the Department of Public Works during yard operation hours.

Paint (water-based/latex) can be deposited inside the regular trash container once dried (by air or by using sand or kitty litter). Please do not bring paint to the Department of Public Works complex.

Motor oil, car tires, and car batteries may also be deposited at your local gas station and auto parts retailers. Televisions can also be dropped off at Goodwill stores to be recycled.

Solutions to Storm Water Pollution

Cherry Hill Township remains committed to storm water management practices, and encourages our residents to do the same! Please keep in mind these helpful, environmentally-conscious tips in and around your home:

- Keep litter, pet wastes, leaves and debris out of street gutters and storm drains—these outlets drain directly to lakes, streams, rivers and wetlands.
- Dispose of used oil, antifreeze, paints and other household chemicals properly—not in storm sewers or drains. Contact the Camden County Division of Environmental Affairs at (856) 858-5241 to find out when the next Household Hazardous Waste Collection day is being held.
- Clean up spilled brake fluid, oil, grease and antifreeze. Do not hose them into the street where they can eventually reach local streams and lakes.
- Control soil erosion on your property by planting ground cover and stabilizing erosion-prone areas.
- Have your septic system inspected and pumped, at a minimum every three to five years, so that it operates properly.
- Purchase household detergents and cleaners that are low in phosphorous to reduce the amount of nutrients discharged into our lakes, streams and coastal waters.

In addition to these helpful tips, the Township's Public Works Complex at 1 Perina Boulevard continues to accept any unwanted electronics, light bulbs, batteries and tires. These items are properly recycled, and thus lessen the environmental impact on our waterways and landfills.
